Landmark #16 Machu Picchu Peru

Machu Picchu is a 15th-century Inca citadel located 2.430m above sea level in the Cuzco **Region** (Peru). Most archaeologists believe that Machu Picchu was built in fairly recent times, as it was probably commissioned by the Inca emperor Pachacuti (1438–1472). However, it is often mistakenly referred to as the 'Lost City of the Incas' because it was abandoned roughly a century after its construction on account of the Spanish **Conquest.** Although popular locally, Spanish conquistadores didn't know of its existence, so it remained unknown to the outside world until American historian Hiram Bingham brought it to international attention as late as 1911. Machu Picchu was built in the **classical Inca style**, with polished dry-stone walls. Its three primary structures are the Inti Watana, the Temple of the Sun, and the **Room of the Three Windows**. Most of the outlying buildings have been reconstructed in order to give tourists a better idea of how they originally appeared – and the **restoration** is not over yet.
